Red Weather Warning – School Monitoring the Situation

Dear Parents/Guardians,

We are writing to inform you that a Red Weather Warning has been issued for our area by The Met Office. The warning is currently in place from 9:00am on Wednesday 24th June until 9:00pm on Thursday 25th June. We are closely monitoring the situation and are in regular contact with relevant authorities as well as the Central Team at the Wessex Learning Trust to ensure the safety and wellbeing of all pupils and staff.

At this time, the school remains open and will continue to do so; however, conditions may change rapidly. We ask parents and carers to exercise caution when travelling and to follow guidance from North Somerset Council and The United Kingdom Health Security Agency (UKHSA) when preparing your child for school. This includes applying sun cream, providing a refillable bottle and to wear comfortable school uniform.

We were able to keep pupils in their regular classrooms this morning, before moving to different spaces around the school this afternoon. This will be the plan for tomorrow as well. Where possible, we will continue to have breaktimes outside, but these will be under cover, using gazebos and shelters where possible.

We will continue to monitor weather updates throughout the coming days and will communicate any changes to school operations as soon as possible. Should it become necessary to close the school or make adjustments to the school day, parents will be notified via our usual communication channels.
